2026 EHS **SERVICE OF HUMANITY** AWARD

Gloria Spillers Hoffmann

CLASS OF 1946



Gloria (Spillers) Hoffmann is genuinely humbled and honored to receive the **2026 Service of Humanity Award**. The award is deeply personal, and Gloria gives tribute to her family,

teachers, friends, and a community that shaped her life of public service.

Gloria was born in Minneapolis, MN, in 1928, and moved to Des Moines as a child. She attended Wallace Elementary, Amos Hiatt Junior High, and Des Moines East High School (EHS) graduating in 1946.

EHS offered a solid learning environment and a culture where differences in race, socioeconomic status, learning styles, and backgrounds were embraced. Gloria made friends easily and was involved in vocal music, tennis, and wrote for the school newspaper which led to her majoring in radio journalism at Drake University.

Gloria began her professional career at Bankers Life (now Principal Financial Group), where she worked in both the Actuarial and Personnel departments. There, she met her husband, Lyle Hoffmann. Married in 1955, they built a family that now includes two children, David and Anne, four grandchildren, and two great-grandchildren.

An ordained elder at Westminster Presbyterian Church, Gloria served on multiple church and Presbytery committees and as a Christian education leader.

At 97, Gloria highlights three accomplishments (shown in the next column):

East High Alumni

In the 1980s, Gloria got involved in the EHS Alumni Association, serving as president from 1986-1987, and thus became the first president of the newly formed Alumni Foundation. She also led the Alumni Scholarship Committee for several years. In 1998, Gloria was inducted into the Alumni Hall of Fame.

Des Moines School Board

Gloria served four terms on the Des Moines School Board from 1983-1995, and twice as board president. In 1990, she helped start the **Success Program** as an initiative which addressed students' social and emotional needs to improve outcomes. The **Success Program** has been going strong for more than 35 years and has been a model for many schools across the country.

Stormwater Infrastructure Advisory Committee

In 2018, a flood damaged facilities, appliances and personal items for Gloria and many others in Des Moines including decades of records from her civic and volunteer work. Gloria became the first chair of a newly formed Stormwater Infrastructure Advisory Committee for the city. A multimillion-dollar masterplan was developed to address major structural needs in 15 watersheds, eight have been completed and the rest are in process. In 2026, Gloria remains an active member on the committee.

Gloria believes public education is a cornerstone of democracy and a transformative force in her own life. Her legacy is not defined by a single honor, but by decades of quiet, steadfast service that have strengthened and uplifted those in the community she serves as Gloria embodies the **Service of Humanity**.

The dictionary defines cheerleader as “an enthusiastic and vocal supporter of someone or something.” Nancy Pike Elliott has embodied those

qualities from her earliest days at East High School through a lifetime of service to her community.

A proud East Des Moines native and second-generation East graduate, Nancy's connection to East began long before she entered its doors in 1965. Fueled by her own enthusiasm, she prepared for high school by attending cheerleading clinics and taking tennis lessons. At East, she became heavily involved in school life, earning three varsity letters in tennis, two varsity letters in cheerleading, participating in Student Council, Senior Board, Pep Club, Homecoming Court and numerous other leadership roles. Her time as a varsity cheerleader was especially formative. “I took cheerleading seriously,” said Nancy, a 1968 East graduate. “I gained confidence and became a leader and met many people still in my life today. I believe what I did as an East cheerleader contributed to the historically spirited East High experience.”

Nancy's many opportunities at East helped shape a career dedicated to education and global understanding. A teacher recommended summer study program in Europe sparked her passion for history. She earned Bachelor's and Master's degrees from Drake University, which allowed her a thirty-year career with Des Moines Schools

teaching history, as a social studies department chair and as a high school administrator at her retirement. Nancy's work extended beyond the classroom through international teacher and student exchanges and initiatives in countries including Mexico, Japan and Russia, as well as collaborations with the U.S. State Department and Sister Cities Commission.

In retirement, Nancy remains an active and passionate supporter of education and community. She has served as an adjunct clinical supervisor at Grand View University and as Executive Director of the Iowa Council for Social Studies. For the past five years, Nancy has led East High Alumni Cheerleaders in honoring elder East alumni with birthday visits which include the East school songs, flowers and fun. This year, visits were paid to Geraldine Daniels (100) at her party and to iconic singer, Marilyn Maye (98), on stage at The Ingersoll. She also supports current cheerleaders and students through service projects, alumni events and school activities, building meaningful connections across generations of East's community in part by serving on the East Alumni Association Board and other committees.

Nancy is also completing a book documenting over a century of East's cheerleading history. She and husband, Rick (Class of 1967), established and have been funding the annual East Cheerleader Scholarship since 2023. They live in Pleasant Hill and have two adult children, Jay (Paula) Elliott (Class of 1992) and Lindsay (Kevin) Peterson (Class of 1995), and four grandchildren - Jaycie (Hunter) and Rhett Elliott and Brody and Mason Peterson.



Patrick Lowe, a 1996 graduate of Des Moines East High School, has dedicated his life to education, athletics, and service to others.

At East, he excelled both academically and athletically, earning varsity letters in four sports — football, basketball, baseball, and track and field — and achieved all-conference honors in each. In track, Patrick distinguished himself as an Elite Team All-State performer in the 400-meter hurdles and set a school record in the event that has stood for more than 25 years.

Patrick continued his academic and athletic career at Wartburg College, where he played football and baseball while earning the President's Scholarship for his academic achievement. On the baseball field, he earned All-Conference honors in the Iowa Conference and concluded his collegiate career competing in the College World Series. He graduated in May 2000 with a degree in history and education.

Following graduation, Patrick began a lifelong commitment to students as a teacher and coach in the Des Moines school district. Patrick's desire to teach was instilled by East history teacher John Bankus.

"I always go back to ninth grade world history...because Mr. Bankus helped me realize that I wanted to be a teacher, a history teacher," Patrick said.

Patrick taught special education at Hoover High School for 11 years before returning to his roots at Goodrell Middle School, where he has spent the past 15 years teaching special education, social studies, and mathematics. "I want to give back, so if I'm going to be a teacher, I want to do it in my community," Patrick said. "There is nothing better than going five blocks away from your house, [being in a classroom] and working with kids from your community. When I'm running on the bike trail, kids are yelling 'hi' to me. It's a great feeling."

In addition to teaching, Patrick has devoted countless hours to coaching. For more than two decades, he has coached high school baseball, football, cross country, and swimming as well as middle school soccer, basketball, cross country, swimming, and track and field. He often coaches multiple sports in a single year. He's currently East's head boy's cross-country coach and assistant boy's swimming coach and Goodrell's head track coach and assistant boys' soccer coach. His leadership has helped many student-athletes continue on to compete at the collegiate level.

Patrick has volunteered with Grandview Little League and Pleasant Hill Soccer Club and has served as a Sunday School teacher at Sheridan Park United Methodist Church. He and wife, Erin, live on Des Moines' east side, where their son Tyler continues a four-generation East High legacy.



Jan Salta's journey began in Des Moines, Iowa, where she was a proud member of the East High School Class of 1966. Following graduation, she

remained in her hometown to attend Drake University before landing in Los Angeles as a flight attendant with United Airlines. In 1974, she relocated to Palm Desert, Calif., where she and her husband, Mike Salta, built a life defined by business success, philanthropy, and a steadfast dedication to community service.

Jan currently serves as president and chairman of both the M.F. Salta Company and the Jan and Mike Salta Foundation, headquartered in Irvine, Calif. Deeply inspired by her parents, she established the Stamos Scholarship at East High School to support students in financial need who aspire to pursue higher education. Her leadership extends to numerous community and cultural organizations, including Trustee and Board of Governors service at Eisenhower Medical Center, the McCallum Theatre Executive Board, as well as a board member of the Palm Springs International Film Festival and the Rancho Mirage Writers Festival.

Through her foundation and personal involvement, Jan has also provided meaningful support to the Living Desert

Zoo and Gardens, Tools for Tomorrow, the Joslyn Senior Center, Sacred Heart Church and School, Martha's Village & Kitchen, and the Circle of Stars at Eisenhower. Her generous contributions and tireless advocacy for the arts, healthcare, and education have earned her multiple honors, including the Mary T. Roche Award in 2016, recognition as one of Palm Springs Life's Women Who Rule in 2017, and a special honor at the McCallum Theatre Gala in 2019.

Jan now divides her time between Newport Beach and Indian Wells, Calif. She is the proud mother of her son, Gabriel, and a devoted grandmother to two grandchildren, Ava (18) and Domenic (14). Her deep roots at East High School span multiple generations of her family: her parents, James and Maxine Stamos (Class of 1936); her uncle, Richard Montgomery (Class of 1953); her sister and brother-in-law, Judy Stamos Harrington and Scott Harrington (Class of 1959); and her cousins, Charles Montgomery (Class of 1973) and Kimberly Montgomery Cisna (Class of 1976).

Throughout her life, Jan Salta has embodied the values of leadership, integrity, and generosity that define the spirit of East High School. Her example continues to inspire future generations to give back, fostering a legacy of service that uplifts both her school community and the world beyond.



Jeff White's life and career have been shaped by a deep belief in community — a value instilled during his time growing up on the east side of Des

Moines and reinforced during his time at East High School. Jeff credits that sense of belonging and shared responsibility as a guiding force in both his personal and professional life.

At East, Jeff discovered his passion for writing and storytelling through English and journalism classes including instructors John Raymond, Ed Kelly and George Christian. The teachers' encouragement set Jeff on a path to study newspaper journalism in college, which later expanded into public relations.

Today, the 1987 East graduate is executive vice president and partner at Flynn Wright, a Des Moines-based advertising and public relations firm, where he has built a career centered on communication, content creation and helping organizations tell their stories.

The ability to communicate has also fueled Jeff's longstanding commitment to community service. Since 2017, Jeff has been actively involved with the East High School Alumni Association and Foundation Boards, serving as president of both. His leadership reflects a broader dedication to education, career development, arts and culture, and community betterment.

Jeff has also contributed his time and expertise to communitywide initiatives including the Hoyt Sherman Place Foundation, Sleepy Hollow Sports Park fundraising campaign, Talent Collective DSM, Bravo Greater Des Moines' Passport to Culture campaign, the Iowa State University Greenlee School Advisory Council and the Public Relations Society of America.

Jeff remains closely connected to his East roots, particularly through the Class of 1987, which has held reunions every five years since graduation and continues to rally in support of fellow classmates and the school. He values relationships deeply and believes that true community means both depending on others and being someone others can depend on.

Over time, Jeff's definition of success has evolved to believing that a life well lived is making a difference. "And the greatest gift is for someone else to say that you've made a difference to them," Jeff said.

Being inducted into the East High Hall of Fame is especially meaningful to Jeff, who draws inspiration from fellow Eastsiders known for their hard work and dedication to giving back. He sees the honor not only as a personal milestone, but as a reflection of the enduring strength of the Eastside community.

Jeff and his wife, Mara, live in Ankeny and have three children.

John M. Van Liew is among the most influential figures in the early history of Iowa high school athletics.

A 1902 graduate of East High

School, he distinguished himself as a gifted athlete and natural leader, serving as football captain as a sophomore—an honor he also earned at Grinnell College.

Van Liew returned to East in 1908 as a coach and teacher. He had both a deep knowledge of the game and a passion for shaping young men. During his tenure at East, Van Liew built the football team into a powerhouse, earning championships, statewide respect, and a legacy defined as much by character and mentorship as by success on the field.

Van Liew held two-week football camps for East's players at his cottage at Clear Lake. After two-a-day workouts, the team would eat popcorn and study the high school football rule book around a campfire. Van Liew was a student of the game of football, a sport that was new to most of his players. (It is said that the coach, fondly referred to as "Van" by friends and players, may have been the first coach to employ a defensive six-man line in football.)

Van Liew tenure at East ended in spring of 1917.

During World War I, Van Liew served as an Army captain and athletic director at Camp Dodge, where he oversaw physical training and athletics. After the war, he accepted a coaching position at Knox (Illinois) College, where he led both the football and basketball programs — often without assistants.

Van Liew's career took him across the country and beyond. He coached at Western State in Colorado, worked with a hopeful Peruvian Olympic soccer team, and later joined North Carolina State University. He went on to spend a decade at Hanover (Indiana) College, where his success in football and basketball earned widespread admiration. Hanover later inducted him into its Athletic Hall of Fame, installed a memorial plaque in his honor and established a "John M. Van Liew Day."

Van Liew concluded his career with additional high school coaching and teaching before retiring in 1954. That year, Van Liew returned to Des Moines as the featured speaker at the East High Alumni Association banquet, where 500 people gathered to honor him. An article in the Des Moines Register quoted a former player: "Van's influence has been felt by all of us. I wouldn't trade what I learned under him for all of the rest of my schooling."

Van Liew married to Nora Briscoe in 1923. The couple had two daughters; Dorothy Van Liew Faith and Elizabeth Van Liew Sellars, and 9 grandchildren. Van Liew died in 1959 at the age of 77.

JASON DALBEY - Class of 1989

2026 ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE



Jason Dalbey, a 1989 East graduate, was a two-time varsity letter in baseball and basketball. In 1989, East baseball team advanced to

the state-sub finals. That year, Jason led the team in stolen bases and outfield

assists. Jason, who graduated in the top 10% of his class, was named to the baseball All-Conference team and Coach's Selection First-Team, All-State. He represented the Metro Conference in the state all-star baseball game, playing for the Large Schools West Super Team.

Jason attended Central College, where he played baseball for four years. He and wife Julie (Anderson) have two sons, Jake and Max.

DeMARCO TURNER JR. - Class of 2006

2026 ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE



DeMarco Turner, Jr., a 2006 graduate, was a multi-sport athlete at East, participating in basketball, football, and track from

2002 to 2006. He earned three varsity letters in basketball, two in football, and one in track.

During his basketball career, DeMarco received First-Team All-Conference honors; earned honorable mention recognition; and in 2005, helped lead his team to a state tournament

appearance. He credits much of his success to his parents, DeMarco and Christina, as well as his siblings, for keeping him grounded and humble. DeMarco also acknowledges his coaches and teammates for believing in him, supporting his growth, and holding him accountable.

DeMarco attended Central College, where he earned a bachelor's degree in business. DeMarco, who is East's head boys' basketball coach, is also CEO of Infinite Hoops, a local basketball organization that provides organized leagues for all age levels. DeMarco and wife, Sydney, have three children: Lyla, Avianna, and DeMarco III.



Haley Larson, a 2012 graduate, distinguished herself as one of the most accomplished players in the history of East's girls' soccer program. She

graduated as the program's all-time leading scorer, recording 71 career goals and 27 assists. Haley was a four-time first-team All-Conference and Academic All-Conference selection. In 2012, she earned Second Team All-State honors from the Iowa High School Soccer Coaches Association in Class 3A.

Haley comes from a strong East High athletic tradition. Along with her sisters,

Paige (Class of 2014) and Zoe (Class of 2016), she represents the third generation of East student-athletes in her family. She also joins her uncle, Jason Reese (Class of 1986), as a member of the East Athletic Hall of Fame.

Following graduation, Haley continued both her academic and soccer career at the University of Missouri–St. Louis, where she earned a degree in public policy and administration. She later pursued a career in education, working in public schools in Missouri and Colorado, and earned a master's degree in teaching from North Carolina State University.

Haley is an elementary school teacher with the Des Moines school district and lives in Des Moines with her family.



Alyssa Thompson, a 2021 East High School graduate, was a four-year member of the girls' varsity bowling team and was a

Second-Team All-State qualifier. During her time on the team, Alyssa contributed in a variety of ways and in the 2020-21 season, earned the most valuable player award. Alyssa was also a member of the cheer team.

Alyssa attended Simpson College, where she earned a bachelor's degree in criminal justice in 2025. She currently works as an assistant teacher and enjoys helping students learn and grow each day. She continues to pursue her long-term career goal of working in probation.

Bowling remains an important part of Alyssa's life. She stays active in the bowling community by participating in local leagues and competing in charity events and tournaments at both the city and state levels.

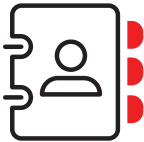

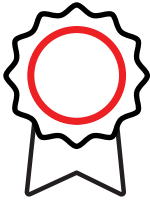
